"An Irish Airman Foresees His Death" is a poem by Irish poet William Butler Yeats (1865-1939) written in 1918 and first published in the Macmillan edition of *The Wild Swans at Coole* in 1919. The poem is a soliloquy given by an aviator in the First World War in which the narrator describes the circumstances surrounding his imminent death. 'An Irish Airman Foresees His Death', by W.B. Yeats. This is one of my absolute favorite poems. It talks of joy, and of pain, of the ultimate uselessness of life, and the determination to carry on with it as well as possible. May it touch your soul as it has touched mine.
